The **CAPSTONE Doctor of Theology Degree in Chaplaincy** equips adult learners with the necessary skills and knowledge to excel as chaplains beyond the Master's level. It offers spiritual care and doctoral level chaplaincy at an advanced level. Designed for an interfaith context, these programs are ideal for chaplains serving in hospitals, hospice, prisons, first response teams, and the military.

The **D.TH.** In **Chaplaincy Degree** assists in letting the world know that you are at the doctoral level within your specialty – chaplaincy. It builds upon the combined work that you have already done at the Bachelor's, Master's, and BCC levels of chaplaincy.

REQUIRED COURSES

There is a set number of Required Courses. The required courses titles, and descriptions follow.

ELECTIVE COURSES

Electives, when included in the requirements for an academic Degree, may include any 400-Level courses from Chaplaincy, Spiritual Care, Spiritual Direction, Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy, or Thanatology.

UNITS of CPE

Some of the students will already have taken 1, 2, 3, or 4 units of CPE elsewhere, and that is ok. Those units you have taken elsewhere, upon approval, will count towards your academic Degree. If you are still in need of 1, 2, 3, or 4 units of CPE in order for you to obtain the required 4 for the Doctorate, or 2 for the Master, we utilize the Graduate Academy of CPE Supervision (GACS).

GACS CPE

3 Required Courses | 4 Electives | 4 Units of CPE | 1 Dissertation

The **CAPSTONE Doctor of Theology Degree in Chaplaincy** is a professional doctorate for experienced professionals who want to translate their expertise into a higher position of credibility, leadership, and influence within the profession.

The **D.TH. In Chaplaincy Degree** combines taught components with independent research in a student's area of expertise. This is achieved by with advanced research skills and specialist knowledge in their area of expertise, so they have not only the ability but also the confidence to facilitate change at a corporate level. The fundamental difference between a PhD and a professional doctorate is that while PhDs teach students how to conduct research to create new knowledge that improves the understanding of a field, a professional doctorate teaches a student how to evaluate, synthesize and apply existing knowledge in novel ways to a field.

The D.TH. In CH Degree Learning Outcomes:

Students will demonstrate knowledge, skills, and dispositions associated with:

- Assess the current state of knowledge within professional chaplaincy.
- Develop expertise in a particular area of professional chaplaincy, such as care for a particular community, spiritual assessment, ethics, or other practice areas.
- Learn about and use research methods.
- Advocate for changes that support clients, organizations, and the community through an action research project. This project enables you to focus on an everyday problem or unmet need and develop a plan for remediating the issue.
- Expand the body of knowledge within professional chaplaincy through their research findings.
- Conduct effective analyses of chaplaincy processes and policies.
- Gain skills for designing and implementing programs within chaplaincy departments.

Students will participate in courses, assignments with deadlines, and the opportunity to learn with likeminded professionals. The Degree ends with the student writing a **Dissertation** that identifies a topic within **Chaplaincy**, investigates it through research, and proposes practical solutions. This involves undertaking experiments, collecting results, and documenting the process. In addition, general suggestions are made as to how others in their field can practically use the research findings, and other problem areas may be identified for future investigation.

Doctorate-level courses combine taught components with independent research in a student's area of expertise. Students will be challenged and encouraged to utilize specialist knowledge and advanced research skills in each course to evaluate, synthesize, and apply their learning to the field of professional Chaplaincy.

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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

SC441 Theological Reflection

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course introduces theology as a practice of creative and critical reflection on humanity, the world, God, and/or source from a multi faith perspective. Theological themes in dialogue with insights from the natural sciences and current social justice issues that challenge today's communities will be addressed. By connecting the theological tradition with science and social justice, students will consider how to reflect on and express faith in an informed dialogue with other fields of study that are essential to a holistic understanding of our world today.

SC442 Pastoral Formation

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: Course content includes a survey of the history and development of spiritual practices in religious tradition and highlights engaged practice as a primary means of shaping and living out one's spirituality. Emphasis is placed on the application of learnings to one's life and ministry/counseling practice.

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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - CONTINUED

DD422 Doctoral Project and Dissertation Writing

3 credits

Description: This course serves as an introductory course in the dissertation writing process. This course deals with both the theoretical and practical aspects of designing dissertation research and with writing the proposal and dissertation. The core objective of this course is to provide guidance and motivation to the doctoral student so that the methodology and the entire prospectus will be approved by the student's dissertation committee. This course also provides students with the opportunity to interact with colleagues who are engaged in the same process.

CDP444 Capstone Dissertation Paper

15 credits

Description: SCA UTS doctoral programs consist of three primary components: the coursework, the experiential education, and the dissertation. The student completes coursework to develop and hone critical thinking skills, writing skills, and knowledge. The units of CPE act as the internship putting skills and theories learned into praxis and practical application. The purpose of the coursework is to prepare the student to become a doctoral candidate. The doctoral dissertation is the final academic requirement for the doctoral program and is designed to evaluate the candidate's capabilities as a scholar.
