The CAPSTONE Doctor of Theology Degree in Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy is designed to enable professional caregivers to broaden their educational scope to address individuals' spiritual needs effectively. The curriculum is tailored for those wanting to specialize in (a) Spiritually Integrated Psychotherapy. It encompasses key areas such as: (b) Pastoral Counseling that draws on multi-faith sacred texts, (c) Psychodynamic Psychotherapy which is a psychotherapeutic approach focusing on an individual's spiritual beliefs, religious practice, and how their experiences impact their psychological life. This approach ensures that students are well-equipped to provide comprehensive care that includes spiritual support.

REQUIRED COURSES

There is a set number of Required Courses. The required courses titles, and descriptions follow.

ELECTIVE COURSES

Electives, when included in the requirements for an academic Degree, may include any 400-Level courses from Chaplaincy, Spiritual Care, Spiritual Direction, Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy, or Thanatology.

UNITS of CPE

Some of the students will already have taken 1, 2, 3, or 4 units of CPE elsewhere, and that is ok. Those units you have taken elsewhere, upon approval, will count towards your academic Degree. If you are still in need of 1, 2, 3, or 4 units of CPE in order for you to obtain the required 4 for the Doctorate, or 2 for the Master, we utilize the Graduate Academy of CPE Supervision (GACS).

GACS CPE

The **CAPSTONE Doctor of Theology Degree in Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy** is a professional doctorate for experienced professionals who want to translate their expertise into a higher position of credibility, leadership, and influence within the profession.

The **D.TH. In Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy Degree** combines taught components with independent research in a student's area of expertise. This is achieved by advanced research skills and specialist knowledge in their area of expertise, so they have not only the ability, but also the confidence, to facilitate change. The fundamental difference between a Ph.D. and a professional doctorate is that while PhDs teach students how to conduct research to create new knowledge that improves the understanding of a field, a professional doctorate teaches a student how to evaluate, synthesize and apply existing knowledge in novel ways to a field.

The D.TH. In CPP Learning Outcomes:

Students will demonstrate knowledge, skills and dispositions associated with:

- Assessing the current state of knowledge within professional Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy
- Learn about and use research methods.
- Advocate for changes that support clients, organizations, and community through an action
 research project. This project enables you to focus on an everyday problem or unmet need and
 develop a plan for remediating the issue.
- Expanding the body of knowledge within professional Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy through their research findings.
- Gain skills for designing and implementing programs within chaplaincy departments.

Students will participate in courses, assignments with deadlines, and the opportunity to learn with likeminded professionals. The Degree ends with the student writing a **Dissertation** that identifies a topic within Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy, investigates it through research, and proposes practical solutions. In addition, general suggestions are made as to how others in their field can practically use the research findings, and other problem areas may be identified for future investigation.

Doctorate-level courses combine taught components with independent research in a student's area of expertise. Students will be challenged and encouraged to utilize specialist knowledge and advanced research skills in each course to evaluate, synthesize, and apply their learning to the field of professional Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy.

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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

CP421 Human Spirituality and Development

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course reviews major streams of theory in developmental psychology and discusses the biological, neurological, spiritual, and physiological factors that affect human development, functioning, and behavior. Ethical and culturally relevant strategies for promoting resilience and wellness across the lifespan will be discussed.

CP422 Spiritual and Pastoral Counseling for Individuals

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course explores the basic dynamics of interpersonal relationships and the characteristics and behaviors that influence the counseling process. Students will learn to employ essential interviewing, counseling, and case conceptualization skills.

CP423 Premarital and Family Counseling from a Spiritual Perspective

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course identifies common marital and family dynamics. Attention is placed on the impact of heritage, attitudes, beliefs, understandings, and acculturative experiences on an individual's views of others. Students learn strategies for identifying and eliminating barriers, prejudices, and processes of intentional and unintentional oppression and discrimination.

CP424 Spiritual Small Group Ministries

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course reviews the stages of group growth development, group dynamics associated with group processes, and explores therapeutic factors and how they contribute to group effectiveness. Other topics include, group formation, recruiting, screening, and selecting members, and other considerations that affect conducting groups in varied settings.





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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - CONTINUED

CP425 Spiritual Assessment and Evaluation

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course explains the historical perspectives concerning the nature and meaning of therapeutic and spiritual assessment, explores methods of effectively preparing for and conducting initial assessment meetings. Appropriate diagnostic criteria as a guide for individual intervention is also covered.

CP426 Spirituality and Mental Illness

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course describes the major categories of psychopathology and identify common differentiating features of abnormal psychological functioning.

CP427 Spiritual Competencies in Practice: Research & Evaluation

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course prepares the student to do and to evaluate social science research using a variety of research methods. The course material encompasses both quantitative and qualitative methods in the discussion of the basic components of the research process: conceptualization and measurement, sample selection, and causal modeling. It also discusses theories of program development and models and strategies for assessing factors that contribute to career development.

CP428 Spirituality and Care Ethics

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: This course reviews the ethical standards of professional counseling organizations and credentialing bodies, and applications of ethical and legal considerations in professional pastoral counseling.





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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - CONTINUED

Description: Electives

Any 400 Level Course will work here including Chaplaincy, Spiritual Care, Spiritual Direction, Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy or Thanatology. Those who are taking electives are subject to what is available each particular Term / Semester. If there is a particular one that you are excited to take, please discuss this with your Academic Advisor.

DD422 Doctoral Project and Dissertation Writing

3 credits

Description: This course serves as an introductory course in the dissertation writing process. This course deals with both the theoretical and practical aspects of designing dissertation research and with writing the proposal and dissertation. The core objective of this course is to provide guidance and motivation to the doctoral student so that the methodology and the entire prospectus will be approved by the student's dissertation committee. This course also provides students with the opportunity to interact with colleagues who are engaged in the same process.

CDP444 Capstone Dissertation Paper

15 credits

Description: SCA UTS doctoral programs consist of three primary components: the coursework, the experiential education, and the dissertation. The student completes coursework to develop and hone critical thinking skills, writing skills, and knowledge. The units of CPE act as the internship putting skills and theories learned into praxis and practical application. The purpose of the coursework is to prepare the student to become a doctoral candidate. The doctoral dissertation is the final academic requirement for the doctoral program and is designed to evaluate the candidate's capabilities as a scholar.
