## The School of Spiritual Direction

The **CAPSTONE Master of Theology Degree in Multifaith Spiritual Direction** equips students with the expertise to become Spiritual Directors in diverse environments, blending theoretical knowledge with practical skills. It emphasizes understanding spiritual practices, principles, ethics, and diversity in spiritual service. A significant focus is placed on developing profound self-awareness and engaging with sacred texts and spirituality from multiple perspectives. Students learn introductory research methods, fostering engagement with diverse voices for professional growth and collaboration. The program concludes with a thesis that combines research with practical solutions, preparing students for thoughtful and effective spiritual guidance.

#### **REQUIRED COURSES**

There is a set number of Required Courses. The required courses titles, and descriptions follow.

#### **ELECTIVE COURSES**

Electives, when included in the requirements for an academic Degree, may include any 300-Level courses from Chaplaincy, Spiritual Care, Spiritual Direction, Clinical Pastoral Psychotherapy, or Thanatology.

#### **UNITS of CPE**

Some of the students will already have taken 1, 2, 3, or 4 units of CPE elsewhere, and that is ok. Those units you have taken elsewhere, upon approval, will count towards your academic Degree. If you are still in need of 1, 2, 3, or 4 units of CPE in order for you to obtain the required 4 for the Doctorate, or 2 for the Master, we utilize the Graduate Academy of CPE Supervision (GACS).

#### **GACS CPE**

# M.TH. in SD | 45 Credits

## 9 Required Courses | 0 Electives | 2 Units of CPE | 1 Thesis

The **CAPSTONE Master of Theology Degree in Spiritual Direction** provides students with the skill set and knowledge to serve as Spiritual Directors in a variety of settings.

The **M.TH. in SD Degree** coursework is designed to combine theoretical and practical learning, attunement to experiences, trying out spiritual exercises, connectedness to the body, combining multiple perspectives, and the critical reading and application of research.

#### The M.TH. in SD Degree Learning Outcomes:

The Spiritual Direction master's program allows students to gain knowledge and skills related to:

- The current state of knowledge within professional Spiritual Direction, including spiritual practices, philosophy, principles, and legal and ethical responsibilities.
- Acquiring and developing experiences with sacred texts, theology, spirituality, and diversity in ministries of service and support.
- Profound self-awareness, including one's own internal movements and patterns of reacting to others and to circumstances, and welcoming differing experiences of the divine.
- Introductory use application of research methods.
- Engaging diverse voices and networking for personal and professional growth,
   collaboration, leadership, and change transformation.

Students will participate in courses, assignments with deadlines, and the opportunity to learn with likeminded professionals. The Degree ends with the student writing a **Thesis** that identifies a topic within Spiritual Direction, investigates it through research, and proposes practical solutions. In addition, general suggestions are made as to how others in their field can practically use the research findings, and other problem areas may be identified for future investigation.

Master-level courses combine taught components with independent research in a student's area of expertise. Students will be challenged and encouraged to utilize specialist knowledge and advanced research skills in each course to evaluate, synthesize, and apply their learning to the field of professional Spiritual Direction.

# The Master Multifaith Spiritual Director

#### COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

#### **SD321** Introduction to Spiritual Direction

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

**Description:** This course provides a fundamental understanding of the profession of Spiritual Direction, as well as exploring the spiritual self as instrumental with a focus on the experiential dimension

#### SD322 Mysticism in Theistic and Non-Theistic Traditions

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

**Description:** This course provides a structural dialogical model for understanding spirituality and mysticism, applying it to personal spiritual life and to religious traditions. Emphasis place on exploring different form of prayer.

#### SD323 The Self and Living a Spiritual Life

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

**Description:** This course focuses on the developmental and phenomenological approaches to the Self.

## SD324 Spiritual Disciplines: Practices that Transform Us

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

**Description:** This course explores Individual and collective spiritual practices, characteristics of religious learning and development, shadow work, and growth in being present.

# SD325 Dynamics of Transformation

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

**Description:** This course explores general features and themes of several multifaith traditions and the dynamics of transformation.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - CONTINUED**

#### SD326 The Self and Living a Spiritual Life II

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

**Description:** This course explores perspectives of the Self in society and contemporary culture with an emphasis in multifaith spiritual work.

#### SD327 Professional Standards in Spiritual Direction

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

**Description:** This course discusses ethical practices for spiritual directors. Skill practice includes knowledge about setting up a spiritual direction practice with emphasis on contract creation, arc of sessions, professional relationships, and displaying Self in the service of the client.

#### **CD328** Themes of Spiritual Direction

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

**Description:** This course explores themes of ecology, gender, globalization, illness and others as well as time given to allow for the exploration of a student chosen topics.

# MT321 Master's Project and Thesis Writing

3 credits

(No prerequisite required)

Description: The Master's Project and Thesis Writing course aims to foster the development of the core knowledge, skills, and abilities needed to construct a thesis. In this course learners will be guided through a step-by- step process of preparing to write a thesis, writing the Introduction, Literature Review, Methods, Results, and Discussion sections of a thesis, and will also partake in giving peer feedback and editing and revising each section they have produced. Various tools will also be introduced and utilized which will aid in the entire thesis construction process. Additionally, upon completion of this course, students seeking a doctorate will have laid the foundation for their thesis.

#### CTP333 Capstone Thesis Paper

6 credits

**Description:** As part of their degree requirements, all SCA CAPSTONE master's students must complete a project, thesis or practicum. The master's thesis option offers graduate students the opportunity to engage in research with a faculty member. A master's thesis document presents the theoretical foundation, methodology, results, and implications of a research endeavor. A thesis project may be a clinical or non-clinical empirical study, methodological study, meta-analysis, systematic review, or a novel analysis of existing data.
